

KVK, West Garo Hills conducted Training programme on “Fodder Production” under NICRA

One training programme on “Fodder Production” was conducted by ICAR, KVK, West Garo Hills, Meghalaya on 2nd July 2019 in Rimrangpara village under NICRA project. Lecture was delivered by the KVK expert about the importance of fodder in livestock farming. Participants were taught about the different types of fodder grasses and trees that can be grown in the village. Emphasis was given to establish fodder banks in the villages to help the farmers during scarcity period. A total of 22 interested farmers participated in the training programme. Participants were taught about the cultivation methods of different types of perennial fodder grasses like Para, Guinea, Hybrid Napier, Congosignal, and Stylosanthes and trees like Subabul and Bauhinia. KVK personnel demonstrated the plantation techniques of root stocks of Guinea grasses in the selected plot (Community fodder plot) in Rimrangpara village and completed plantation of grasses in around a half bigha land along with the farmers.
